Under the new [WorkSafeBC](#) legislation amendment to the Workers Compensation Act, all asbestos abatement contractors must be licensed to operate in British Columbia, and all workers who perform asbestos abatement work must complete the mandatory safety training and hold a valid certificate. These requirements will come into effect as of January 1, 2024.

Prerequisites and Materials:

- Course will be presented in English; a working command of English is required
- Minimum age is 18 years old
- Bring government-issued photo ID for the certification exams
- All course material, student workbooks, tools and equipment will be provided
- Level 1 is a pre-requisite to Level 2, but may be registered for together
- For Level 2 training, all course participants will require a NIOSH approved personal ½ mask air purifying respirator with P100 cartridges on all course days. option to purchase a half-mask respirator (or use shared class resources)
- For Level 2, come to class clean shaven for proper respirator seal

Q: Who is required to have abatement certification under the new regulation?

A: Everyone who performs asbestos abatement work, including abatement / restoration / renovation / demolition contractors; trades that offer abatement in addition to their primary service; employees of municipalities, school boards, health authorities, and utilities if performing asbestos abatement work in relation to a building

Q: Can I challenge the WorkSafeBC exam if I have industry experience?

A: Contact WorkSafeBC; you may be able to challenge the exam during the implementation phase, if your employer provides the training curriculum to WorkSafeBC for review. There is no automatic 'grand-fathering' of existing workers.
